SECTION 2 — HAZARDS IDENTIFICATION

Hazard Class: Carcinogenicity (Category 1). May cause cancer (H350). Obtain special instructions before use (P201). Do not handle until all safety precautions have been read and understood (P202). Use personal protective equipment as required (P281).



Hazard Class: Sensitization, skin and respiratory (Category 1). May cause an allergic skin reaction or asthma symptoms or breathing difficulties if inhaled (H317+H334). Avoid breathing dust or fumes (P261).



Hazard Class: Germ cell mutagenicity (Category 2). Suspected of causing genetic defects (H341).

Hazard Class: Reproductive toxicity (Category 1). May damage fertility or the unborn child (H360).

SECTION 4 — FIRST AID MEASURES
